

Jazz Flight Attendants Vote 99% in Favour of Strike Mandate

TORONTO, ON – September 4, 2026 – Members of the Canadian Flight Attendant Union (CFAU), employed by Jazz Aviation LP and working aboard flights operated under the Air Canada Express brand, have delivered an overwhelming strike mandate after months of bargaining. Ninety-seven per cent of eligible members cast a ballot, with 99 per cent of votes cast in favour of authorizing the Union to call a strike if necessary.

A strike mandate does not mean a strike is imminent. It reinforces the bargaining committee's position by demonstrating the membership's unity and resolve. The Union's immediate focus remains on reaching a fair agreement.

"Our members have spoken clearly. With 99 per cent voting in favour, Jazz should have no doubt about where its flight attendants stand. Several important issues remain under discussion, and the detailed proposals belong at the bargaining table. Our members expect an agreement that fairly recognizes their work, responsibilities and working conditions. Jazz has agreed to return to bargaining, and we expect the company to come prepared to make meaningful progress," said Marsha Walters, CFAU President.

*"The CFAU recognizes that Jazz is a regional airline and that its operation, including the ground work performed by flight attendants, differs from that of mainline carriers. The Union is seeking a compensation model that fairly recognizes the work CFAU members actually perform within the Jazz operation. If the work is required, it should be credited. **Safety does not begin at takeoff,**"* Walters added.

CFAU members work aboard more than 350 flights each day, operated by Jazz on behalf of Air Canada and serving 65 destinations across North America.

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
